Procedure: Doffing PPE	Yes	No	Comments
1. Staff member is able to verbally explain doffing.			
2. PPE is removed before exiting the resident's room (except respirator, if worn).			
3. If a respirator is worn, the staff member removes the respirator after leaving the resident's room and closing the door.			
4. Gloves are to be removed first: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff identifies that outside of glove is contaminated. • Using gloved hand, grasp (or pinch) the palm area of the other gloved hand and peel off first glove, turning glove inside out. • Hold removed glove in gloved hand, slide fingers of ungloved hand under remaining glove at wrist, and peel glove off over first glove • Discard gloves in appropriate waste receptacle. • If hands become contaminated during glove removal, the staff member immediately washed their hands or applied alcohol-based hand sanitizer (for appropriate infectious diseases).

<p>5. Goggles or face shield (if mask used to be last):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff identifies outside of goggles or face shield is contaminated. • Touching head band or earpieces remove goggles or face shield from the back by lifting head band or ear pieces. • Discard in appropriate waste receptacle. • If hands become contaminated during goggle or face shield removal, the staff member immediately washed their hands or applied alcohol-based hand sanitizer (for appropriate infectious diseases). 			
<p>6. Gown:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff member identifies front and sleeves of gowns are contaminated. • Unfasten ties from back, while sleeves do not come into contact with the staff member's body when reaching for ties. • Pulling gown away from neck and shoulders, then only touching the inside of the gown, remove gown by turning gown inside out or grasp the front of the gown and pull away from the body so the ties break, touching the outside of the gown only with gloved hands. • Fold or roll in ball/bundle and discard in appropriate waste receptacle. • If hands become contaminated during gown removal, the staff member immediately washed their hands or applied alcohol-based hand sanitizer (for appropriate infectious diseases).
